2014, a Year in Review

Clearly there was demand for bowlers to get their news out there on a national scale to other bowlers. We hope that you have all enjoyed reading each others stories, along with those from National Council sources.

We have aimed to cover the whole spectrum of bowling, from local league to international event, from Juniors to Seniors, and everything in between, such as Women's National Council; Deaf Bowling; Proprietors; and Students. If there's anything we've missed, please let us know!

From looking at just the front pages of each issue it is clear a lot has happened, and the pages behind them contained even more stories. It has been a fantastic year for bowling in many ways.

There have been some amazing achievements: our Team England bowlers excelled in international competition - we've seen Junior medals at the EYC and World Sports Festival; a Bronze men's team medal from the World Youth Championships in Hong Kong; the Adult Ladies retained their team Gold at the EWC in Berlin; while the Seniors (and other age groups) found success at the Triple Crown.

There have also been many milestones: Pat White retired as Chair of the BTBA after many years of distinguished service and Bernice Bass marked 40 years; while Steve Wright and Alan White celebrated 50+ years as BTBA members.

We've seen lots of new developments: a Local Association Grant scheme; a BTBA Tour; the Team England Trials format; a coaching programme; an expanded



Women's National Council (& successful Trios event); on-line membership renewals; the affiliation of British University bowling; the launch of the Southern Scratch League; Team England sponsorship from Storm; and DV8 Bowling and BowlingVision sponsorship of Junior Team England to name just a few!

There really has been a lot to celebrate this past year, which we hope you will all keep in mind as we move forward this year. We are confident that future editions will be packed with just as much (if not more) wonderful news!

Farnborough - Dave Steiner reports...

16th November saw Farnborough Bowl in conjunction with the Hampshire BTBA run what is hoped to be the first of an Annual event a Handicap Diamond Threes. With only a ten lanes centre everyone involved with the organisation were very pleased that only two places were not filled in the first squad and hope that all 18 teams will put the event in their diaries for next year.

Daniel Bonfield set the standard right out of the blocks, having dragged the rest of the family out on a Sunday he had to be seen showing some effort. 481 for his two games singles followed by 487 for his two games in the doubles helped him to 1426 for six games and laid down a marker down for the rest of the field. I know his friends will say easy on the left but you still have to produce the performance on the day which he certainly did. Ably supported by Alison Taylor and her dad Pete 3483 scratch, 3819 with handicap looked a very good team score to beat.

A team, made up on the spur of the moment, of three bowlers from the Big Boys club took up the challenge. Although none of the three are league bowlers in Farnborough two train regularly in the centre and put local knowledge to good use. Shanine Gill put her first game of 242 to start the charge making 1122 her best six game total for some time. Val Hopcroft continuing her improving form over the last year added 1059 to the total and Phil Staff completed the team, Pin Tickers, which with handicap produced 3838 to push BadassBowling into second place.

Other performances of particular note were the 265 from Mark Icke playing for the Glonks and Andy Woods 258 bowling for Finger Cone Fist.

Some rough edges need to be smoothed for next year's tournament but nothing that distracted from the tournament as a whole and I hope the players enjoyed the tournament as much as we did hosting it. Alan White, a BTBA member for more than 50 years, gives us this nostalgic look back to bowling in the 1960s. There are still many of us around In Kent/Essex who will fondly remember some of the names he mentions from the SEBA (South East Bowling Association) days. Many thanks Alan!

I started open bowling in 1961/2 at the Playbowl, Wanstead, East London which was a seven lane centre then owned by Oscar Owide who I believe now owns lots of property in Soho, London.

I remember when I started that there was a mixed doubles league at Wanstead that consisted of several people who were later to become very well known in bowling – Rita and Morris Glaser, Enid and Harold King, Dolly and Lou Hart and Gladys and Ron Notley. I later joined this league with Betty Stenning.

Other bowlers at Wanstead were Malcolm Riddall, Roy Payne, Paul McCutcheon, Geoff Polaine, Peter Fountain, Ernie Woolard, Dave Dann and Barry Wright.

I became lifelong friends with Dolly Hart and Barry Wright who have both now passed away.

In 1961/2 I joined the Mayday League which was a trios league and also the Mixed Doubles League. I was then asked by Dave Dann if I would join his five man team "Canada Dry" and we bowled in leagues and tournaments in many of the original bowling centres and also at RAF and American air bases.

At Wanstead we several times had demonstrations of bowling by Paul Lane, Jim Brewer and Lee Kates.

In the 60's and 70's I bowled in leagues at Stamford Hill, Southend, North Harrow, Dagenham and Grays. I have been a continuous member of the BTBA from when I started bowling to now. I later served on SEBA (Southern Area Bowling Assn) with Brian Langford and Brian (Buzz) Morrison. Also ECTA (Essex County Tenpin Assn.) and was for many years on the BTBA National Council where I worked on the World Championships at Tolworth and other International Tournaments held here. I also worked as Duty Manager at the Princess Bowl at Dagenham for thirteen years under Brian Morrison and Brian Langford. I actually have the opening programme for Princess Bowl, Dagenham.

It may be of interest to mention that in the Tenpin Monthly of April 1962 the top averages for men were 186 by Ray Haggan and 179 by Lee Kates both at Golders Green and 179 by Tony Samuels at Leytonstone. Ladies were all at Stamford Hill – 152 by Mitzi Rose, and 151 by Enid King and 150 by Rhoda Brewer.

I have many great memories of bowling especially from the great days of bowling in the Supreme league at Stamford Hill when there were so many great bowlers in the teams there – Len Gaston, Brian & Joe Michaels, Bobby Mansfield, Tony Samuels, Bernie White, Phil Russell and many more..

Bowling has been a major part of my life!!

Aylesbury has been without a bowling centre since the sad closure of Jardines in 2012, but many will be pleased to see familiar Jardines face Kevin Pollard who is centre manager of the new 14-lane facility and brings with him over 40 years experience. Kevin will be assisted by another of Jardines former employees, Ian Bishop.

On the opening night it was the honour of Jardines former owner, Stan Adams, to roll the first ball, with Buttons (local man Andy Collins) throwing the second.

The air-conditioned warehouse unit has a fully licensed bar and café-style restaurant serving drinks and hot and cold food as well as ample parking. There is also free wi-fi for all customers. Rogue Bowling will be open 10am until 11pm Monday – Thursday, until midnight Friday and Saturday and until 10pm Sunday.

With Kevin being a great ambassador for the sport - discussions are already taking place about which tournaments can be held at Rogue Bowling. Sanctioning will be applied for in the New Year with the Buckinghamshire Adult & Senior County Roll-offs being held there during 2015.

Rogue Leisure Limited has been providing indoor karting facilities in Aylesbury since early 2005 (under the Rogue Racing name) and the plan is to move the karting next to the bowling during Summer 2015.

The Rock Masters is a Seniors tournament, which is organised by Matchpoint Tours who also run the Tenpin Tour Seniors tournaments. The top six male and female bowlers on the tour order of merit each year receive free entry and hotel accommodation for the tournament.

This year the format of the tournament was changed from previous years, to mirror that often adopted on the European Seniors tournaments, with qualification being through two blocks of 6 games, making a twelve game qualifying total. Re-entry squads are available to allow bowlers to improve their total qualification score. Additional qualification spots were available for the men through Turbo games and a Desperado squad. Age bonus was set at one pin for every year of age over 50. The pattern for the tournament was Kegel Easy Street, which for some was to prove anything but easy.

Unusually, it was not possible to prebook qualification squads, the six available squads were filled by a random draw which took place the night before the first squad, thus ensuring that all competitors were in Gibraltar before the tournament commenced. All bowlers were scheduled to bowl one squad on Wednesday and one on Thursday, with two optional re-entry squads on Friday.

At the end of Wednesday, all bowlers had completed six games, and in the men's section, American Ed Roberts was in the lead, some 20 pins ahead of Scot Alan Keddie, with Ken Burton some way behind in third place. The ladies section was led by Angie Brown, ahead of Angie Morgan and Liz Griffin.

Wednesday evening saw the first of the informal tournaments held each year, the Nations Cup. Bowlers and non bowlers were organised into 5 man teams, and were representing a nominated nation. Some flexibility is always allowed in the team names, this year the little know nation of East Anglia was well represented. After two games of baker format, the field was cut, and a further game cut to just four nations. *Continued on the next page...*

These four battled it out in matchplay format, with Scotland emerging victorious, comprising Alan Keddie, Gordon Humphries, Sandra Boswell, Catherine Wills and Liz Griffin.

The Thursday qualifying squads saw more high scoring. Ed Roberts stayed at the top, but now had only a slight lead from Tony Imren who had a very strong second block, with Dave Rawding moving into third place. The top two men would miss first final round, so everyone was keen to be in the top two positions. In the ladies section, Angie Brown retained top spot, a little ahead of Angie Morgan, with Jan Steiner now moving into third place.

Following on from the Thursday squads was the second informal tournament, the Partner's Cup. This was nominally restricted to 'other halves', but some leniency was available. After two games of Scotch Doubles, the top 14 teams played a further game before the final four teams played one deciding game. Thanks to the support and coaching of Graham Coles, the Gibraltar Association president, this was finally won by Angie and Tony Brown, the left/right handed combination helping greatly in a Scotch Doubles format.

A good number of bowlers elected to bowl in the re-entry squads, but the positions at the top in both sections remained unchanged. The cut to the men's finals was 24^{th} place, taken by Colin Crouch, and the final qualifying lady in 8^{th} place was Sue Richards. Phil Boswell also qualified as the Turbo winner, and Andrew Ward took the last spot through a great Desperado competition. For those who failed to make the finals, they would get a further chance to compete on finals day in the Plate competition.

The first finals round of 4 games took place on Friday night, this was comfortably won by Mike Sykes, ahead of Jeff Taylor and Barry Knox. Only 14 from this round would go forward, and the final place was Richard Morgan.

Early Saturday morning saw the Plate competition for those who had not made the final day. John Dunmall won the men's section with an excellent score of 922 over the four games, ahead of Dave Montgomery. Catherine Wills took top spot in the ladies, ahead of Julie Johanssen.

Next came the semi-final round, and after 6 games it was again Ed Roberts and Alan Keddie at the top. Sixth and final qualifier for the final was Richard Morgan. The ladies section also had familiar names at the top, Angie Brown leading from Angie Morgan with Sue Richards being the sixth and final qualifier.

Ed Roberts started the men's final strongly, with 244 with bonus to take an early lead in the six person Round Robin. Ed continued to bowl consistently, making good use of his 21 pins per game bonus to finish the fourth game just two pins ahead of Alan Keddie. The final game saw the two leaders pitched against each other, and Ed Roberts ran out an easy winner 279 to 218, with Alan Keddie finishing in second place, ahead of Jeff Taylor.

In the ladies section, Sandra Boswell started 260, 218 to open up what

looked like a commanding lead over Angie Morgan. Previous leader Angie Brown had a disastrous start with 158, 183 to be well at the back of the field. Sandra had another solid game in Game 3, and then the end pair caught her out in game 4 with only 145 to slip behind Sue Richards. This opened the door for one of the trailing bowlers to make a big push for the line. Sandra moved past Sue with a 206 game, but Angie Brown finally got matched up, and finished 219, 239 to squeak a 6 pin victory.
