The 2014 BTBA AGM took place at Holiday Inn Express South, Luton on 24th May in front of more than 40 delegates, the National Council and representatives from the multi-medal-winning 2014 European Youth Championships England Team.

Following approval, full minutes from the AGM will be published on -line. These will be accompanied by presentations given by members of the Executive and National Councils.



As Ron Griffin and Dave Steiner were voted-in as Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the BTBA, Gill Hutchison lead tribute to retiring BTBA Chair Pat White, to a spontaneous standing ovation from the delegates, who recognise the huge contribution that she has made to the BTBA, especially in directing the BTBA through the "Time to Change" transition period.

Last month I reported on our bowler of the month scheme, where we asked bowlers to nominate through their league secretaries bowlers who they feel are worthy of winning the bowler of the month award. - Sukky Gill who, in the scratch trios, recorded a new personal best with games of 261,246,254 for a 761.

A list of strong candidates and some fantastic achievements - but we thought there could only be one winner and that is Jeff Taylor. Many congratulations Jeff!

Bedfordshire Area Challenge

Bedfordshire's Area Challenge Championships were again held at Dunstable GoBowling who supported the event with a great lineage rate. 3 divisions Men's, Ladies and Seniors. Rather than stick with the all too easy house pattern, the tournament manager, Basher Bonfield, decided that as 'challenge' was in the name of the tournament, then a 'challenging' pattern should be laid. So the tournament was played on the Kegel Sport Winding Road pattern, which threw up some surprising results. In the Men's, Bert Mamril took the title with a handicap total of 1126 a

scratch average of 184, which was 29 pins over Bert's entering average. In the Ladies, Elaine Walker was the winner with a handicap total of 1019. But the stand out performance was in the Seniors where Jeff Taylor shot the tournament high score with a scratch total of 1113 a 223 average. Playing on a sport pattern was a real eye opener for some, and they now realise and appreciate just how bowler friendly the usual league conditions are.

Congratulations to Dunstable YBC who again picked up awards at the

NAYBC Nationals. A particular well done Ria Hunter and Toni Melton who, bowling in their first Nationals, finished 3rd in the doubles in their age division with Ria (below) also winning the encouragement award!

Norwich YBC, Teresa McCarthy reports...

The club's junior players returned from the NAYBC (National Association of Youth Bowling Clubs) Junior Nationals in Coventry with five gold, two silver and two bronze medals. The youngsters were presented with their various prizes from the competition at their weekly coaching sessions at the Namco Funscape bowling alley in Bowthorpe on Saturday morning.

Vice-chairman Stuart Pates, said: "The buzz around the club at the moment is brilliant. We came away from the nationals with a hefty haul of medals, but the most important thing was that it was right through the age groups.

"We pick up young players from four or five all the way through to 18, and the older ones finish their games quicker, so they all came down to see the youngsters finish and support them, so as a club the camaraderie was great."

In the singles competitions Dominic Welch took the gold medal in the male Inter category with a dominant 612 total to finish 35 points clear of his nearest rival, after scoring 216 and 215 in two of his games, to finish 10th overall in all the divisions. Pates added: "Dominic's previous personal best was 503, so that 600 score was a fabulous new personal best for him, it was outstanding. "I was on the lane next to him and he was just unbelievable. It was fantastic to see his father, other parents and other Norwich bowlers cheering him on, I felt proud of the whole club."



Olivia McCarthy also won the female Peewee gold with a total of 291 and won the all events gold at Peewee level, with a combined total score of 774 from her singles, doubles and team games.

In the doubles Norwich claimed silver at Peewee level thanks to Louie Dawson and Kyle Williams' combined score of 693 and bronze at Bantam after Jake Everitt and Nicola Betts bowled 788.

There was also a silver in the Inter class after Alex Pates and Jordan Simpson registered 1,072 and a gold in the female Inter doubles after Kathryn Betts and Abigail Cater bowled 991.

The combined performances led to an overall male team gold for Norwich, thanks to a combined score and tournament record of 2,374 from Ed Benton, Alex Pates, Robert Cater and Jason Chown.

There was also a team bronze at Peewee level thanks to the combined score of 1,447 from Nicola Betts, Louie Dawson, Kyle Williams and Jake Everitt.

Pates added: "The club is buzzing about the medals and even for those who didn't pick up a medal, they still feel like winners. "As a club I really feel we achieved something extraordinary and as a coach it was great to see all the little ones achieving with their bowling as well."

Four of the club's young bowlers will be returning to Coventry later this month to take part in the Junior Triple Crown Trials, attempting to qualify to bowl for England. Robert Cater, 15, will compete in the under-16 boys' trials and his sister Abi Cater, 13, in the under-16 girls' trials, while Jason Chown, 15, and Ed Benton, 17, will compete in the under-19 boys' trials.

Like most county associations, the beginning of May saw Warwickshire host their Area Championships. This year it was held at Nuneaton, and was an event that was to see some of Warwickshire's finest shoot some great scores!

Individually, this included a 277 game from Damon Arkell, and a 279 game from Gavin Greaves, however topping the high game leader board was Gareth Greaves with a spectacular 299 game. Series wise, Nicky Donowski showed great form shooting back to back 680's with a 682 and a 689. Whilst in the men's division Gavin Greaves topped the list with a high series of 777.

The scratch team event was won by team Warwick, who averaged as a 4 man team, 937 a game. This equated to an overall team total of 2811, and was made up of Gavin Greaves who shot a 777 series, Pete Stevenson a 751 series, Gareth Greaves a 697 series and Jenny Turnbull a 586 series. The

handicap team event was won by one of our younger teams called I can't believe it's not gutter, and they bowled a handicap score of 2907. This consisted of Jay Goodwin, with a 738 series, Kyran Barnes, with a 722 series, Tom Daly, with a 662 series and Chris Daly, with a 785 series.

The doubles event was to see another Donowski (Steve Donowski) on great form. Steve and his partner, Jeff Gilbert were unbeaten in both the scratch and handicap division. Scratch they shot a total of 1360, with Steve shooting a 725 series and Jeff a 635 series.

The last event was the singles event. The scratch male singles was won by Gavin Greaves who shot a 693 series and the handicap male singles was won by Chris Daly with a handicap series of 793. Not to be outdone by her dad, Nicky Donowski also decided to win both the handicap and scratch sections of an event. For Nicky, this was the female singles event, where she shot a scratch series of 689.

Lancashire County Championships – Michael Glover reports...

This year the Lancashire Area County Championships took place at MFA Preston Bowl on Sunday 11th May 2014. The tournament manager was our Chairman Edwin Whitehead. We had decided this year because of the low number of entries to just have a handicap doubles and a four man team section for juniors and adults followed by a stepladder Masters which would be taken from the scratch scores.

The event was well supported by the junior section but only four adults entered which was disappointing. In the junior doubles section the winners were Olivia Cogley and Connor Mudge from Liverpool YBC who put a commendable 1364 in with handicap followed by Ben Haythornthwaite and

Alice Pell from Preston with a 1292. In third place were Jack Burrows and Joshua Green also from Preston with 1265

In the adult section Dave Glover and Chris Green beat their team mates George Glover and Carl Taylor from Wigan to come top with an 1137.

The junior team event was again won by 4 of the Jim Missen gang from Liverpool YBC namely Terri Rowan, Paige Johnson, Olivia Cogley and Connor Mudge who put a total pinfall plus handicap of 2549 followed again by one of the three Preston YBC teams comprising of Ben Haythornthwaite, Alice Pell, Shaun Eccleston and Ryan Turner. In third position only 7 pins behind second were Jacob Finch, Sam Griffith, Katy Shaw, and Abigail Bowie also from Preston.

The adult team winners were a foregone conclusion with only one entry.

From the scratch scores the stepladder finals took place to find out who was going to be the 2014 adult and junior Lancashire County Champions. In the adults, Chris Green was just beaten by Carl Taylor 199 to 192. In the semi-final Carl went on to beat George Glover 202 to 179, but in the final Dave Glover retained his top position by closely beating Carl 175 to 168

The four juniors to qualify for the final were Connor Mudge in fourth Alice Pell in third Shaun Eccleston second and Sam Griffith in first.

Alice Pell showed her skills and determination to closely beat Conner Mudge 176 to 173 but Shaun Eccleston came in on the semi-final and after a close game came out victorious against Alice 182 to 172. In the final Sam Griffith showed his ability by putting in a 224 against

Shaun's 163.

As a result we had Dave Glover as Adult County champion taking home the full size Wilkinson Sword trophy which the late Albert Pursglove on behalf of Lancashire TBA, bid for and won in a sporting auction back in the 1960s. First of all a short introduction to the Committee which is made up of Nikki Harvey, Ann Nagle, Linda Buckland, Emma Ashton, Katie Jowsey and Lisa John. For the past few months we have been forming a strategy to put the focus back onto Women's Bowling in England with a view of 2015 being the year of focus on Equality and Diversity.

Secondly a BIG thank you to all that took part in the Women's National Council survey which was mainly gathered from Ladies at the BTBA Nationals in Romford. This has given us a huge insight into the minds of

Women bowlers in order for us to further enhance our strategy and proved to us that we were on the right path. Full results are published on the BTBA website.

Some key points from the survey is that most people asked had been bowling for more than 10 years and participation had increased during that time. Budget is the biggest barrier to entering a tournament, but people would be willing to travel over 50 miles to bowl. Having a tournament that consisted of a combination of events and a social element also appealed to a lot of you

British Universities - End of Year Round Up

BUTBA Cup Final



After months of Cup matches, it was whittled down to the best four university teams this season; the University of Nottingham (UoN), the University of Sheffield, the University of Birmingham and Loughborough University, to battle it out for the coveted title of BUTBA Cup Champions. All four teams travelled to Acocks Green Bowl in Birmingham to bowl it out for the cup on Sunday 18th May 2014.

Each university fielded a squad of 12 bowlers spread across 3 teams. Each team would play their equivalent from the opposing university, with individual and team points available for game and series. Being the only other scratch event on tour after BUCS, the competition was set to be fierce.

Semi-final 1 saw Nottingham take on Birmingham - only dropping half a point in the first game, and a single point in the second, Nottingham advanced to the final after winning 58.5 vs 1.5. Semi-final 2 pitted Loughborough (4 -time defending champions) against Sheffield. The match was a close fought affair, Loughborough winning the first game 15 vs 5, and Sheffield winning the second 3 vs 17. Setting up a tense final game which Sheffield won 8 vs 12 (winning 26 vs 44 overall).

Loughborough went into the 3rd vs 4th place playoff which they won comprehensively vs Birmingham 55-5. Sheffield continued to the final to face Nottingham.

Nottingham showed their intent in the first game of the final, winning all but a couple of points. Sheffield staged a comeback in the second game, to make it tense going into the last game, but Nottingham knew the title was close. The standard was very high throughout and the A and B teams exchanged heavy blows, with Sheffield coming away better for the most part, save for a few key points.

There was a convincing win by the C team from Nottingham, which helped secure an 8 point victory in the last game for Nottingham and an overall win of 35-24. The University of Nottingham were crowned BUTBA Cup National Champions in the awards ceremony that followed, and many other high score awards handed out.

Chesterfield Quads



The final Order of Merit event for the 2013/14 BUTBA Calendar saw teams travel to Chesterfield to play in another matchplay event - this time in quads teams. The student winners were Nottingham Trent University, Birmingham were a close second, followed by Loughborough in third. The ex-student winners were 'Dave and the Finalists'.

Sheffield Alumni Match



On 10th and 11th May, over forty alumni members of the Sheffield Students Tenpin Bowling club met for their 6th reunion in Sheffield. The club was formed in 1967, so this was their 47th anniversary. Bowlers came from Australia, America, Canada, Indonesia and Europe to spend a weekend with friends, relive memories, and play a challenge match against current students. The next reunion will be in 2017, which will be their 50th Anniversary.

Nottingham Varsity

One of the most spirited pairings for competition in BUTBA is definitely a face-off between the University of Nottingham and Nottingham Trent University. On the 2nd June MFA Nottingham was host to their annual

varsity match - the two universities pitted five of their bowlers against each other in a handicapped diamond fives format. Wins were exchanged throughout the first few games, before UoN began to pull away to a 4-2 lead, but needing just one more point to win they could not quite close the door on a resurgent Trent team who fought back hard to eventually win 4-5.

- Name: Jon Zadel

• Summarise your "Coaching Philosophy": There are a few principles that I like to follow when I'm coaching. A couple of these are summarised nicely by 2 of Einstein's statements. Firstly, "If you can't explain it simply, you don't understand it well enough". This really does sum up my coaching style. Secondly, "Insanity: Doing the same thing over and over again and expecting different results". This is what I would say to all the people that complain because they don't improve, but are unwilling to make changes to their game or work hard at it so they do progress. I am very interested in the science of the sport and believe that if players understand this, as well as what they are up against, their scoring potential will be much higher. Finally, I believe in using the best players in the world, 'Professional bowlers', to make comparisons to and explain how the sport is played at the highest level.

• Describe your Team England ambitions: I would love for us to retain our Gold in the Team event in the European Women's Championships in June.* I also want both our women and men to be a dominant force in World bowling. I feel we have a great deal of talent and potential in our squad already, as well as coming through our youth ranks. If we work as a team unit anything is possible.

• What do you enjoy most about coaching tenpin bowling: In the competitive environment, the pressure and adrenaline buzz. I find the strategy fascinating and when we get it right the results can be amazing. On the day to day side during lessons, I enjoy making players bowl better and helping them realise their potential.

• Describe what coaching success is: My first instinct was to say 'Winning'. In today's climate we are all very results based and determine success by how much someone has won. At the top level of the sport I guess this is true. However, not everyone aspires to being a World Champion so my second thought was, if as a coach you help someone to become better and exceed their expectations you've done a good job.

• What one change would you make to improve the sport of bowling in this country: From a coaching and personal viewpoint I would love us to have a national training centre. A Kegel style centre where all BTBA members could use the facility to improve their game. Having access to the latest C.A.T.S, video analysis, high tech lane machine and coaching.
