
BTBA Tour Poole Senior Open

Tunbridge Wells – Simon Herbert reports...

The 2013/14 season of our Tuesday Singles League ran for 31 weeks with 38 bowlers and saw more than 450,000 pins being toppled, 22 x 700+ series, 2 x 750+ series, 606 x 200+ games, 49 x 250+ games, 2 x 299 games, overall season league average of 172.

As impressive as these statistics are it's not just the numbers that define a season or a league. We are a league with members of all abilities and levels of experience. Some are seasoned veterans returning for another go at the title or hoping to improve on their last season scores but this year has also seen lots of new faces. Some are venturing into the world of adult leagues after leaving YBC and others are just discovering bowling as a sport. Some of the newcomers may be a little older than others, but that doesn't seem to make any difference. There have been surprising results throughout the whole season and points have been

won and lost in the tenth frame on more than one occasion.

One highlight of this season came in week 10 as last season's champion Tim Standell took on Hannah Smith. Tim had a slight advantage gaining 4 pins per game although he didn't need them for the first game as he fired a 268 against Hannah's 252. An impressive start, this was already looking like an exciting night. Hannah wasn't going to give in though and came back in game two with 267 while Tim dropped back to 209. All level going in to the final game and still four points to play for, but Hannah was now carrying a 42 pin advantage (well actually, 38 pins with Tim's handicap). It didn't take long for Tim to start stringing the strikes and fight his way back, hammering home 265. Hannah's series lead was almost gone but she finished strong with 225. The final series scores were 742 to Tim and 744 to Hannah. Amazingly close, but remember that handicap? It meant 6 points to Tim and just the 2 for Hannah!

It was however the turn of Andrew Tapping to take the top honours in the league, with 177 points. Followed by Darren Moore on 162 and Simon Herbert on 160 (closely followed by Josie Bricknell, 156 and Hannah Smith, 155). As well as the main league title, there are two knockout competitions up for grabs. Up first, the League Knockout. This was won by Charles Pomfret in his first season in an adult league beating his way through four rounds to beat lan Humphrey in the final. The second knockout saw Tim Standell make it to the final only to be beaten by James Mansell. A great conclusion to a great season.

Other honourable mentions this year include:

□ Monique McPherson who bowled her highest series to date with 731 (258, 258, 215) and followed it just two weeks later with a new high game of 287

□ Simon Herbert with a new high series and game (299, 701)

□ Francis Morgan in his first season hit a high of 196

During the last couple of years, Sue and Alan Loft have spent more time in hospital or visiting each other in hospital than they have on the lanes. The less-than-welcome score between them currently stands at 3 hip replacements, 3 knee replacements, two wrist, one ankle, one major back and one major shoulder op, not counting time out waiting for the procedures and recovery afterwards. All these operations have left them with restricted mobility, especially as regards hand/arm movement. Most people would pack it in, but this determined couple asked me for coaching instead. And it's working! My favourite moment so far is watching Sue convert the 6-7-10 split as well as the 9-10 and the 6-10 (twice in a row) - and they weren't accidents. Then I overheard Alan's happy comment: "I picked up more spares in this one game than I generally do in a series!"

The QubicaAMF Bowling World Cup, A History: Perfect Games

There were a number of things that took time before they were seen at a Bowling World Cup. Women and 300 games are just two. It wasn't until the 8th in Hamburg that there was a women's division when Mexico's 45 year old Irma Urrea took the title and to this day remains the oldest female champion. The men's first winner back in Dublin was Lauri Ajanto from Finland. It wasn't until 1994 in Hermosillo, Mexico, when it reached its 30th anniversary did the World Cup see its first perfect game. Canada's Jack Guay managed the feat and as if to show it was no accident he did it again the following year in San Paolo, Brazil. Since then and until number 48 there have been forty 300 games rolled by men and nine by women. Apart from having the most participating nations in 2004 Singapore had the most perfectos with eight. All change in Krasnoyarsk when a new record 14 were bowled. In the past Jason Belmonte from Australia and Osku Palerma from Finland had both had a deuce of 300s in an event in 2011 and 2006. It was when Ireland's Christopher Sloan repeated the feat in Krasnoyarsk that it made you think that a two-handed delivery was a pre-requisite - not at all. During the 24 game qualifying Tore Torgersen (Norway) finished his 9th game with 6 strikes in a row, moved lanes and had 12 more and moved lanes again and had another 12 - thirty strikes in a row and consecutive 300 games. Tore had earlier missed out with a 290 and later in qualifying was to hit 299.
